FINAL ORDER ON RECOUNT


Comes now the Court and finds that the Recount Commission has completed their task as of December 15, 2008. The Court finds as follows:

1. That the Recount Commission has recounted the votes cast, from all thirty-one (31) Miami County precincts for the offices of Miami County Auditor and Miami County Recorder. Said votes were from the General Election held November 4, 2008.
2. That the person receiving the highest number of votes for the office of Miami County Auditor was candidate #82, Republican, Jane Lilley, receiving 6,575 votes. The person receiving the next highest number of votes for the office of Miami County Auditor was candidate #83, Democrat, Betty Hunter, receiving 6,539 votes, a difference of thirty-six (36) votes. The Court finds Republican, Jane Lilley, has won the race for Miami County Auditor.
3. That the person receiving the highest number of votes for the office of Miami County Recorder, was candidate #86, Republican, Brenda Meadows Weaver, receiving 6,596 votes. The person receiving the next highest number of votes for the office of Miami County Auditor was candidate #87, Democrat, Vicki Wheeler, receiving 6,574 votes, a difference of twenty-two (22) votes. The Court finds

Republican, Brenda Meadows Weaver, has won the race for Miami County Recorder.

4. The Court wishes to acknowledge the diligent work of the Recount Commission and extends its gratitude and appreciation to Mary Costin, John Evans and Brent Davis. The Commission is now discharged from their duties.
5. The Court finds that the cost of the recount totaled \$675.00. The Petitioners paid a bond of \$620.00. Pursuant to Indiana Code 3-12-6-17.5 the three Commissioners shall be paid a total of \$225.00 each for their service. The remaining fifty-five dollars (\$55.00) not covered by the bond shall be paid without appropriation from the County General Fund.
6. The Court further authorizes the Sheriff of Miami County to release all previously impounded voting materials back to the Clerk of Miami County immediately.
